SEE SOMETHING? SAY SOMETHING!

Together with the hospitality industry, let's end human trafficking.





- > Multiple men coming in and out of a room
- > A man or woman watching the room or pointing men to the room
- > Guests who appear fearful or show signs of bruising or other physical harm
- > A person asking for extra towels or sheets
- > A person not making eye contact and often unable to speak for themselves
- > Guests using cash at check in
- > Unregistered guests visiting room
- > Male visitors coming to a room but they don't know the name of the guest in the room
- > Excessive condoms or other sex paraphernalia
- > Refusal of cleaning services
- > Please pay special attention to children or those who appear to be under 18



Say Something. TAKE ACTION!

Follow your instincts. You could play an important role in helping free someone from an abusive and dangerous situation!

- > **Tell your manager** if you see something above. Give as much detail as you can.
- > The senior person on the property at the time must **call the police at 911** or the human trafficking hotline.
- > If you suspect prostitution, call the police as it might be human trafficking.



Report All Suspicious Behavior.

- > ALL cases of possible prostitution or trafficking must be reported to the G6 hotline at 800-392-6677
- > Call the National Human Trafficking Hotline **888-373-7888**.



STAY SAFE.

- > **DO NOT** investigate the case yourself or confront the people involved.
- > **DO NOT** resolve the situation by asking the guests to leave the property.
- > Call the police and the hotlines instead.
